

## Dear Friends of TND,

In a single stroke, or with the opening of one new building to be exact, TND reached a number of milestones in 2022. St. Therese, located on Broadway across from the library, is our first property to open in Everett. St. Therese includes a 6,700 square foot health center, designed to deliver health and wellness services for the seniors in the building and in the community. And with 77 rental homes and six condos sold to first-time buyers, St. Therese is the largest development TND has ever built. This coming year, we are celebrating TND's 45th anniversary, which will give us the opportunity to reflect on more agency milestones.

The occasion of TND's sapphire anniversary already made us think of a way to best sum up our organization's work in a few words. Not an easy exercise considering all that TND does, but *Build Homes, Raise Voices, and Connect to Resources* says it all. If I could add one more thought to the theme, it would be *together* as TND rarely works alone.

St. Therese, for example, is a partnership with East Boston Neighborhood Health Center. In 2022, together with La Colaborativa, our CONNECT hotline supported 476 households and leveraged \$4.1M in rental assistance. Jointly with GreenRoots, CHAPA, and the City of Chelsea, TND held a series of workshops for residents on zoning. Likewise, in collaboration with the Revere Housing Coalition, TND facilitated powerful workshops on inclusionary zoning, a tool cities use to fund affordable housing. The 611 households living in our homes are all supported by our Resident Services team in partnership with WinnResidential, the property mangers of our buildings.

We also partner with individual members of our communities to preserve Chelsea, Revere, and Everett as places that welcome immigrants. Our most significant work is focused on raising the voices of people with lived experience – we know that our neighbors have the solutions to the issues our communities face, we have to listen and to organize.

TND knows that we can't tackle the big issues alone – nor do we even want to. We owe our successes to our commitment to collaboration and the mutual trust we have with our community members. There is only one way to effectively build homes, raise voices, and connect people to resources: by doing it together.

Community members came together in many settings to raise their voices in support of more affordable homes and to connect to beneficial resources.

Together with Greenroots, Citizens Housing and Planning Association (CHAPA), and the City of Chelsea, TND hosted workshops about zoning.



Rehab of Chelsea Legacy begins. By the end of September 2023, 116 affordable homes in Chelsea will receive new roofs, fire sprinkler systems, kitchens, baths, new flooring, and a fresh coat

of paint.

CONNECT's financial coaches held three sessions on financial basics for working in America at the Revere Pathways Program, with 80 high school students in attendance.

CONNECT's housing assistance hotline team set a record by completing 70 rental assistance applications in the first half of April prior to the end of the Rental Assistance Program.

By the end of the tax season, the VITA team returns. In total, helped families and individuals claim \$459,459 in refunds.

In Revere, our team coordinated two focus groups on inclusionary **zoning** in three languages, with over 30 community members in attendance.

The lottery for St. Therese townhomes and senior apartments took place, with 330 households seeking to purchase one of the six townhomes, and 540 applicants for 77 rental apartments.



The Resident Services team distributed 140 backpacks filled with school supplies for students in TND properties.

TND's signature fundraising event, Raise the Roof, expanded, with 150 people in attendance and \$240,000 in sponsorships and donations.

Together with La Colaborativa, our **CONNECT** hotline supported 476 households and leveraged \$4.1M in rental assistance.


